

10 YEARS of RCR Studio's Video Ministry



After the end of Earl Poysti's ministry, who was perhaps the most recognized Russian-speaking <u>radio</u> preacher, we realized that in the context of the rapid development of digital technologies, some changes were needed in our studio. Trusting that God would help us, we switched to a new format, and in **2015** began to produce <u>video</u> programs and podcasts. This happened despite our lack of a video studio, suitable equipment and experience in video editing!

The first video released was the testimony of Pastor Yuri Keletgeut from Chukotka, on our "Choice" program. This episode opened a new page in the history of our media ministry.

Over time, we equipped a new video studio with modern video equipment. Today our studio team includes 6 people (see photo below) who were trained in video editing and camera work.

Our team's achievments over the past 10 years included: creating **1,200 videos**, taking about **50 filming trips** to other cities and conferences, growing an audience of **217,000 subscribers**, receiving **71,000 comments** from viewers (on all platforms), attaining over **86,000,000 total views** and listens, and completely **updating rcr.ru**, our Russian-language website.

I would like to separately mention the contribution of our program hosts. <u>Natalia Chernyakova</u> has been serving with us for 20 years! She has hosted 480 video programs as well as 350 radio broadcasts, primarily the "Choice" program. <u>Denis Gostev</u> has released 430 video programs,

and <u>Vladimir Gorlan</u> has released 43 programs.

We praise God for RCR Studio's 10 fruitful years of video ministry and for the many lives God has touched through our programs.




The Gospel Behind Barbed Wire Prison Magazine

The end of my sentence is equivalent to the end of my life. My sentence is life imprisonment. But I am not despondent, like all the other convicts. And you cannot even imagine how much strength, faith, and hope you give with your magazine, The Gospel Behind Barbed Wire, to all the brothers and sisters in Christ who are in captivity, especially those sentenced to life imprisonment. - Alexander M. 


Pirkko Home Ministry at Rumyantsevo

Dear friends, we are glad to greet you from our Pirkko Home "Liberation" Center" in Rumyantsevo! We would like to share news from our rehab ministry. Thank God, as some men progress through our program and move on, we are working with new men whom the Lord sends our way!



I hope you remember and have been praying for our brother Dmitry from Udomlya, Tver region [we shared his testimony in the last Reporter], who intended to stay and help with our





ministry here in Rumyantsevo after he completed the recovery program, and more importantly, after he accepted the Lord Jesus as his Savior. We are happy to inform you that Dmitry is now serving with us as we reach out to help the newly arrived guys. God sent us both him and Arthur, another co-worker, as my assistants. Dmitry is in training, going through all the stages of ministry, and most importantly, learning how to love people, reach out to them, accept them as they are and bring them the Gospel by word and personal example. This is not easy, but Dmitry has a desire to learn and achieve spiritual growth. At the same time, he wants to make a covenant with Jesus through water baptism in the local church later this year. 
The next thing I would like to tell you about is the new men in the program. The circumstances have changed, as we have previously written, such that now we have to look for new people – not many come on their own. We pray for people, put up notices several places, and use various Internet platforms to inform them about us: who we are and that we provide help to any person with addictions of any kind, for free. The Lord sees and hears and we have several new men in the program.



Timofey is from Krasnodar. He's an educated man, with two higher degrees, and is very wealthy, but he came to us with a drug problem. His twin brother died of an overdose and Timofey thought that his life could end the same way. Through a believer he learned about our center and decided to come. It is hard for him, but he is taking small steps. Praise God.







In April of last year, Nikolai was in our program, but then we learned that he had cancer. At that time, we tried to help him, but without qualified medical help we could not





cope and he had to be admitted to a specialized hospital. While he was undergoing treatment there, we were praying for him. After the treatment, he decided to come back to us, almost a year later, with the words that without the Lord he would die. We gladly took him into the program again. Praise God for Nikolai, and for our answered prayers. We believe that this illness and healing will become for him the voice of God and a call to solve the main problem, called sin.











Our other big news is the renovation of the second floor of the Rumyantsevo Pirkko Home. Dear brothers and sisters, we have long planned to implement this project, but for various reasons it did not work out; there were no funds and/or there were no people who had the skills needed. Thank God, today we have already made decent progress. We dismantled the floors and walls of the second floor. They were very old and dilapidated, but the main problem was not this, but the bedbugs, which we tried to get rid of for 5-7 years. Sometimes we thought we had succeeded, but it only lasted for a while, then the same problem came again. In the end, we removed all the old plaster, treated the walls and are now re-plastering the walls, painting them, and are re-laying flooring. Yes, the renovation is going in very small steps, since we don't have the means for everything all at once. We thank the Lord that such an opportunity exists at all!
